
Through the years...by Judith Ann Glasse

Our story begins on February 26,1937 when a son was born to Neil and Violet Glasse in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. As he grew up he earned the family nickname, "Tuffy" because of his various activities, like tying up his sister to a tree in the backyard playing Cowboys and Indians, nearly setting the house on fire, and always defending his sister from bullies at school. Norma Carr and I used to joke that God took his Mom home at an early age to "spare" her from Neil's escapades! (Norma was Bro. Glasse's secretary who discipled me as a new Christian when I began working in the UCM office in 1973.)

As youngsters he and his sister Rosemond, started attending an Assembly of God church. However that was not until Neil was "bribed" by his godly grandmother into going to Church on Sunday if he wanted to attend the Saturday western matinees.

Neil told me once he was so well behaved in Church, everyone thought he was saved. But one Sunday morning, the Holy Spirit drew him, and he said he stood up and shouted as he felt the power of God like 220 volts of electricity go through him. When Rosemond lived with me for eight months after Neil went home to glory, she recalled as they walked home from Church one night, he told her he was going to "preach the Gospel." However he became very ill when he was about twelve and the doctors wanted to remove his voice box. His praying grandmother refused and Neil said that Jesus came into his hospital room and healed him.

As he grew into his teens, godly ministers groomed him for the ministry as they saw God's call and anointing on him. Bro. Kitchen told him, "Son, always shoot for the moon. If you miss, you'll at least hit the tater hill." Rev. William and Dr. Ruth Parcher of Miracle Church ordained him into ministry on July 18, 1955. Dr. Ruth had a radio ministry and this was his




Founder Neil Glasse and Judith Ann Glasse

first exposure to broadcast ministry. He also received ordination through Life Bible Fellowship of Chickasha, Oklahoma on January 30, 1957.

In the years following he ran from God because of many abuses he saw in the lives of ministers, and moved to California. There in the desert of Palm Springs, having reached the end of himself, he put a loaded revolver to his head and fired. He told me he will never forget the sound of that hammer falling on a dud shell.

He said he doesn't remember how long he was before the Lord, but God told him he would put his voice around the world if he obeyed Him, and only give Jesus the glory. (This was later fulfilled through various international shortwave broadcasts, and many AM and FM stations in the western United States, including a Mexican border station of 100,000 watts that blanketed a good part of the United States) It was then he began Unveiled Christ Ministries. His very first week, a lady came up to him and handed him fifty dollars and said, "Bro. Glasse, the Lord says you're supposed to go on radio." So he did, and the UCM daily radio broadcasts have continued for fifty years.

Based in southern California he travelled extensively as an evangelist especially along the western coastal states. Finally in 1970 the folks that would meet at Danish Hall where he held his Oakland services, pleaded with him to move there and open a He rented a beautiful Lutheran German Church. Church at the corner of 41st and Telegraph in Oakland. Then on Memorial Day, 1973 I came back "home" to Berkeley from New Orleans and stayed in the home of Lee and Ann LaCoss. It was there I heard the Gospel and gave my heart and life to Jesus, and was filled with the Holy Spirit. In the next few weeks, we heard the "Unveiled Christ to the World" broadcast on Radio Station KFAX for the first time. Bro. Glasse was announcing a Solemn Assembly with prayer and fasting for the nation.

We came and Bro. Lee began working in ministry by leading worship, preaching, and running the printing presses. I had no aspirations for ministry at that time, so I was happy to volunteer what I felt I *could do* and that was clean the Church. Shortly thereafter Bro. Glasse offered me a part time job working in the office, and the rest is history!

Even in those early years we were committed to team ministry and seeing God's people develop their callings and giftings. Many had their first opportunity in singing or preaching as Bro. Glasse encouraged them to "obey God." Evangelism was always an important aspect of UCM and we began regular weekly services in San Jose at the Civic Center. Bro. Glasse continued to travel while pastoring including a visit to the Carville Leper Colony in Louisiana, and later he and Lee visited the Leper colony in Molokai, Hawaii.

After three years Bro. Lee and his wife moved back to the Northwest to begin their own ministry locally and internationally. At that time I took over as fulltime worship leader. When Bro. Glasse was out of town once in the late 1970's he asked me to handle the midweek service. My first sermon was an hour and a half! (I was definitely a "novice!")

On January 1, 1980 we were joined in Holy Matrimony by Rev. Lee LaCoss and Rev. Robert McElroy, Rosemond's husband, presiding at a new location in Hayward, CA. This began a number of years in the Hayward area, with offices on "A" Street and a leased facility called "White Hall."

In the early 1980's Bro. Glasse began to sense the importance of fellowship and we attended a Regional meeting of the Full Gospel Fellowship of Churches and Ministers International of which he had been a member since the late 1960's. He was nominated as an International Board Member which began ten years of service for the Fellowship, involving many meetings and travel. The last two years he was elected as Regional Vice-President over a six state region. During this time,



having a fully operational printing plant, we not only printed our own literature but other ministries as well including the Full Gospel Businessmen Chapters. We travelled much during that time including trips to Fresno, Washington and Oregon in special meetings due to our local UCM radio broadcasts in those areas.

In 1991 at Bro. Lee's invitation we went to minister in Europe in France, Germany and Scotland, which he declared (with the heart of an evangelist) was the "high point" of his ministry. However, he was a devoted and caring Pastor as many testified at his Memorial Service. Later in 1998 Pastor Sandra Mabee and I also went with Lee to teach at a prophetic conference in Belfort, France, as well as minister at a Bible School in Switzerland.

Then in January, 1993 Pastor Allan and Cathy Jump and Sandra Mabee joined us in team ministry at a new location in Castro Valley. After a brief while at the Lake Chabot church we moved to the Oakland Airport Hilton while continuing service in the San Jose area. Pastor Allan passed away very suddenly in 1997 and three months later on Nov. 3rd Neil went home to be with the Lord.

Pastor Sandy and I continued ministering in Oakland regularly with our leadership team of elders and deacons. We also had special area meetings when Psalmist Deborah Miller of Switzerland joined us in 1998 and for the Tabernacle of David conferences.

In 2003 the Lord began to change the focus of the ministry and in 2004 I accepted an invitation from a devoted, long-time member of UCM to attend RHEMA Bible Training Center with her in Broken Arrow, Oklahoma. It was such a wonderful experience I decided to stay for the second year and graduated in 2006. While there I began supporting Native American ministry and went on my first Missions Trip to the San Carlos Apache reservation in Arizona.

After returning to California I spent a couple of years in home improvements and office projects that needed to be accomplished.

In September 2008, I drove my used RV which I had purchased and made a trip for what I thought was a simple time of fellowship with Phil and Angie Davis at Duck Valley, a remote Shoshone-Paiute Reservation straddling the Idaho and Nevada border. The Lord had other plans, for in a heartbreaking and sudden moment, God took Phil home to glory while changing tires on the truck for the trip to Jackpot. Rev. Josie Dickson, the former Pastor of the historic 100 year old Owyhee Presbyterian Church invited me to come to live in her home in Duck Valley while she was in Arizona. I pastored that Church while carrying on UCM and being involved with other ministers in the community with Native Turning Point, Rev. Shirley Frisbee's well-briety program for Native Americans. In 2010 after a trip to Wolf Point Reservation in Montana and a time of rest, I returned to California and then went to Israel with a KFAX tour, along with missionary and UCM Partner Peter Newton and Sis. Shirley. In subsequent years I've maintained fellowship with the saints at Duck Valley, participating in the annual branding and other functions, as well as services at Pastor Chopsie's church on the Hoopa Reservation in California . In 2013 the Lord fulfilled a dream to move out of California to Caldwell, Idaho. The last two years have seen many repairs, upgrades and new construction preparing the UCM office and property for what the Lord has in the days' ahead.

While this is only a limited history of UCM through the years, the outstanding blessing has been the faithfulness of the Lord and of His people. Years ago rather than place finances in tangible assets like church buildings, offices or ministry complex, we chose to invest thousands in the "intangible"—the souls and lives of people, bringing God's presence and anointing through daily radio and countless services. As the return of Jesus draws near, we and other God-ordained ministries are needed more than ever who believe in the power of God and the freedom of the Holy Spirit. To God alone be the glory!


















